LRC Report

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Pam gave a brief update about the recent LRC meetings. There are currently two open cases. Pam did comment we will need to move to a closed session to discuss next steps in one open matter. Ben recommended moving this item to the end of the Board meeting.

Proposed Rule Revisions

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- 10 Caitlin and Ben reported out on the rule (21 NCAC 25 0701) and what the changes are. Rule 21 NCAC 25
- 11 0701 Is related to civil penalties and posting information on the Board's website related to infractions.
- 12 The proposed rule was shared on the screen for everyone to review once more before voting.
- 13 I move we vote to move forward in the next steps with rule 21 NCAC 25 0701 and move to the next
- steps with RRC, Pam, second Herbie. All in favor.

Motion May 2025-02 (White/Aguilar) I move we vote to move forward in the next steps with rule 21 NCAC 25 0701 and move to the next steps with RRC, Pam, second Herbie. All in favor.

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Possible Rulemaking

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Possible new pathway to licensure (Utah)

- 1 There is a certifying exam through Utah that is widely accepted. I wanted to suggest that the Board
- 2 work on rules to allow this additional certification to be accepted as another pathway toward licensure
- 3 with the Board.
- 4 Mark shared the Utah exams information and showed the Board the various options that could be
- 5 accepted.
- 6 Dianne commented on the program the Utah has, and she recommends that the Board does look into
- 7 these other options, and also brought up that Massachusetts has another assessment that could be
- 8 accepted.
- 9 Agency accountability
- 10 Mark commented that the Board does not have authority over interpreting agencies but has authority
- 11 over individuals. Ben and Mark have been looking into the possibly of changing this so that the Board
- 12 can hold agencies accountable.
- 13 Ben discussed that the Board could have injunctive relief to sanction agencies. Mark shared the screen
- to show the proposed language that could add injunctive relief for agencies if they violate the statute or
- 15 rules.
- 16 Mark commented that this would require a statute change. There is a current bill (HB 857) that just
- 17 crossed over to the senate. This injunctive language could be added to the statute if the Board would
- 18 like to move forward with this change. We can discuss further in new business.

Motion May 2025-03 (Shearer/Griffin) I move we move to closed session pursuant to NC General Statute 143-318.11(a)(3) Dianne, second Alicia. All in favor.

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- 20 Mark recused himself from this discussion and left the room.
- 21 Ben gave the Board some background on the person who the LRC has received several complaints about
- 22 related to the person interpreting without a license in NC. The Board has two options, have the LRC
- 23 make the final determination in this matter, or the Board could seek an injunction. If an injunction is
- sought, then the Board would have some legal fees they would incur.
- 25 The Board discussed the options of the matter.
- 26 Ben gave more information about how an injunction would proceed if the Board did move in this
- 27 direction.

Motion May 2025-04 (Aguilar/Gordon) I move we move forward in seeking an injunction against the person interpreting without a license in complaints 24 LRC 004 and 24 LRC 005, and 25 LRC 002 and retain the NC DOJ as legal counsel in this matter Herbie, second Ashley. All in favor.

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Motion May 2025-05 (Griffin/White) I move we go back into open session Alicia, second Pam. All in favor
